#### The Pastoral Care Structure









# Functions of the Year Head & Class Tutor






# Optional subjects: Science




- Am I curious about the environment and the world around me?

Includes accounting (book-keeping)


They will learn how things are done in the real world Ask herself:

- Would advertising, marketing, selling products be enjoyable for me?




#### Art

- Do I like looking at the artistic/ creative work of others?
- Would I like a career in the art /creative world?
- Portfolio required for Art Colleges and some Architecture courses
- Useful for a variety of careers e.g. Advertising, Printing, Graphics, Media, Hairdressing, CAD etc

- Do I like to express myself through music?
- Would I like to learn how to appreciate music?
- Would I like to learn how music is written?
- Do I like listening to music?
- Would I like to learn about different harmonies and sounds?
- Do I already play a musical instrument or would I like to learn how to play one?
- For third level entry a standard of grade 6 or equivalent necessary


# Informing Staff

# Model of Support


- Learning Support is offered based on information gathered and the needs of the student

- Maximum of ten subjects only
- Common level apart from English, Mathematics and Irish where there will be two levels (higher and ordinary).
- Assessed by SEC.










# Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement




#### Floor Plan






